Differentiation:

Questions 1, 4 and 7 (Varied Fluency)

Developing Select appropriate question openers to complete 3 direct questions. Question words 'who', 'what', 'when', 'where', 'which' and 'why' used only.

Expected Select appropriate question openers to complete 3 direct questions. Modal verbs and additional verbs are used as question words.

Greater Depth Select appropriate question openers to complete 4 questions. Includes direct, indirect, reported and rhetorical questions using a variety of question words.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Varied Fluency)

Developing Decide whether a statement is correct by identifying how many direct questions have been used. Question words 'who', 'what', 'when', 'where', 'which' and 'why' used only.

Expected Decide whether a statement is correct by identifying how many direct questions have been used. Modal verbs and additional verbs used as question words.

Greater Depth Decide whether a statement is correct by identifying how many questions have been used. Includes direct, indirect, reported and rhetorical questions using a variety of question words.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Reasoning)

Developing Explain the mistake using knowledge of the components of a question. 'When' used as the question word.

Expected Explain the mistake using knowledge of the components of a question. Modal verb used as a question word.

Greater Depth Explain the mistake using knowledge of the components of a question. Rhetorical question used.

Recognising Questions

Developing

1. A. What; B. Which; C. Why
2. False, because there are only three questions → A, C and D. B is an exclamation.
3. Eugene has placed the verb 'is' at the beginning instead of the question opener 'when'. 'When is everyone coming to your house?' would make sense.

Expected

4. A. Do; B. Are; C. May
5. True
6. Zoe has used two modal verbs in the same sentence so her question does not make sense. 'May I go to the toilet please?' or 'Can I go to the toilet please?' would both make sense.

Greater Depth

7. A. Could; B. How; C. Do; D. Have
8. False, because A is an example of a reported question. There are four questions in total → A, B, C and D
9. Callum has used the incorrect question opener for his rhetorical question. 'Where' should be replaced with 'how' so that the question makes sense.
