Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Application and Reasoning)

## Recognising Exclamations

### Developing

1. **C**
2. **A = exclamation; B = question; C = exclamation**
3. **B is not an exclamation sentence, it is a question because it requires an answer and does not start with how or what.**

### Expected

4. **B**
5. **A = question; B = exclamation; C = exclamation**
6. **A is not an exclamation sentence, it is a question because it requires an answer and is not punctuated with an exclamation mark.**

### Greater Depth

7. **A = !; B = ?; C = !; B**
8. **A = exclamation; B = command; C = question**
9. **B and C are not exclamation sentences, they are questions because they require an answer and need to be punctuated with a question mark. B doesn't start with what or how.**
