

Year 3 Recognising Adjectives in Sentences – Guidance for Parents

Activity:

This activity has been adapted from a Year 2 resource to make it suitable for Year 3. The aim of this activity is for children to recognise adjectives in sentences. There are three questions to complete. The first two questions allow children to practise the skill, while the third question extends them as they have to apply their learning to get the answer.

Vocabulary:

Adjectives describe nouns. They can describe aspects like colour, shape, size and age, amongst other qualities.

Nouns are naming words. It is a person, animal, thing or place.

Recognising Adjectives in Sentences

1. False, sentence B contains the noun 'magic' but no adjectives.
2. Sentence C because the adjective 'shiny' does not describe the size or colour.
3. They are incorrect. In sentence A, 'giant', 'gold' and 'tiny' are adjectives and 'girl', 'necklace' 'bracelet' and 'earrings' are nouns. In sentence B, 'books' and 'library' are nouns and 'three' and 'new' are adjectives.
