# Year 3 What is a sentence? – Guidance for Parents

### **Activity:**

The aim of this activity is for children to practise identifying sentences. There are three questions to complete. The first two questions allow children to practise the skill, while the third question extends them as they have to apply their learning to get the answer.

## Vocabulary:

**Adjectives** describe nouns. They can describe aspects like colour, shape, size and age, amongst other qualities.

**Nouns** are naming words. It is a person, animal, thing or place.

A verb is an action word such as jump, skip, shout.

An **adverb** is type of word that gives more information about a verb. It can tell you how, when, where or how often. Some examples include slowly, yesterday, regularly.

A **complete sentence** begins with a capital letter, has a main clause (see definition) and finishes with a full stop, question or exclamation mark. A complete sentence expresses an idea or thought, always contains a verb and must include the correct punctuation. A complete sentence should always make sense on its own.

A **main clause** is a group of words that make sense on their own. It has a subject (the person or thing that does an action) and verb (the action). For example, Adam eats bananas.
