

## Activity:

The aim of this activity is for children to practise using nouns phrases in sentences. There are three questions to complete. The first two questions allow children to practise the skill, while the third question extends them as they have to apply their learning to get the answer.

## Vocabulary:

A **verb** is a type of word that is used to describe an action such as [jump](#), [skip](#), [shout](#).

A **noun phrase** is a group of words which contains a noun but no verb. For example: a chair; the roses.

**Adjectives** describe nouns. They can describe aspects like colour, shape, size and age, amongst other qualities.

A **preposition** is a type of word used to express time, place or cause, for example: after, under, over.
