## Lesson guide

- Today we are going to be learning some French words and phrases, focussing on greetings.
- Work through the slides, introducing each new word or phrase and listening to the pronunciation. Ask the class to repeat each word/phrase.
- For the question slides, if the children cannot remember the French word, give them two options to choose from e.g. oui/non

## **Objectives covered**

- Listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding.
- Explore the patterns and sounds of language and link the spelling, sound and meaning of words.
- Engage in conversations; ask and answer questions.
- Develop accurate pronunciation and intonation so that others understand when they are using familiar words and phrases.

## Possible class activities and cross curricular links

- Ask the children questions (in English) which the children answer using 'oui' or 'non'.
- Work in pairs have short conversations using the French vocabulary covered.
