Lesson guide

- Today we are going to be focussing on basic French vocabulary for siimple foods and drinks.
- Ask the children to repeat it as a class once it has been introduced.

 French word and listening to the pronunciation. Ask the class to repeat each word back.
- Continue to introduce each word and practise the pronunciation.

Objectives covered:

- Explore patterns and sounds within a new language
- Ask and respond orally to questions
- Listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding
- Appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language
- Develop accurate pronunciation and intonation so that others understand when they are reading aloud or using familiar words and phrases

Possible class activities and cross-curricular links:

- Work in pairs have short conversations using the French vocabulary covered
- Matching activity French words and images of food/drinks covered
- Provision areas put French labels for food and drink up in snack area
