Year 1 Count in 2s – Guidance for Parents/Carers

Activity:

The aim of this activity is for children to practise counting in 2s. There are a number of questions to complete. The first four questions allow children to practise the skill, while the next three questions extend them as they have to apply their learning to get the answer.

Vocabulary:

A **number track** is a representation of the order of numbers when counting. It can go forwards or backwards. It is similar to a number line, but numbers can go up or down in jumps of 1s, 2s, 3s, etc.

A **number line** is a horizontal, straight line that has numbers placed at equal points. Number lines can be used to show either positive or negative numbers. Most number lines begin at 0, however this is not always the case.
