Activity:

The aim of this activity is for children to practise counting in 5s. There are a number of questions to complete. The first four questions allow children to practise the skill, while the next three questions extend them as they have to apply their learning to get the answer.

Vocabulary:

A **number line** is a horizontal, straight line which has numbers placed at equal points. Number lines can be used to show either positive or negative numbers. Most number lines begin at 0, however this is not always the case.
