Year 1 Compare Number Sentences – Guidance for Parents/Carers

Activity:

The aim of this activity is for children to practise comparing number sentences. There are a number of questions to complete. The first four questions allow children to practise the skill, while the next three questions extend them as they have to apply their learning to get the answer.

Vocabulary:

> < = are comparison symbols used to represent more than (>), less than (<) and equal to (=).

- 1. B. 12 8 = 4
- 2. <
- 3. >
- 4. B
- 5. Various answers, for example: 13 + 4 = 9 + 8; 4 + 13 = 9 + 8; 9 + 8 = 13 + 4
- 6. True because 16 7 = 9 and 13 4 = 9. Both calculations are equal.
- 7. Various answers, for example: 8 + 7; 16 4; 13 + 6
