

Activity:

The aim of this activity is for children to practise measuring capacity using non-standard units, such as scoops, spoons or cups. There are three questions to complete. The first two questions allow children to practise the skill, while the third question extends them as they have to problem solve and explain their answer.

Vocabulary:

Capacity refers to how much a container can hold when it is full.
