Year 1 Using Nouns and Verbs in Sentences – Guidance for Parents

Activity:

The aim of this activity is for children to practise using nouns and verbs in sentences. There are three questions to complete. The first two questions allow children to practise the skill, while the third question extends them as they have to apply their learning to get the answer.

Vocabulary:

Nouns are naming words. It can be a person, animal, thing or place.

A **verb** is an action word such as jump, skip, shout.
