## **Comparing Statements**

- 1. A. 20; B. 10; C. 40
- 2. B and C
- 3. A. 8 x 3; B. 16 ÷ 4; C. 11 x 8
- **4.** No, Tina is incorrect because if she swapped the numbers 3 and 4 her statement would be  $5 \times 4 > 36 \div 3$ .  $5 \times 4 = 20$  and  $36 \div 3 = 12$ . The symbol would not need to change because 20 > 12.
- 5. Various answers, for example:  $40 \div 8 < 3 \times 3$ ;  $64 \div 8 < 3 \times 3$ ;  $35 \div 5 < 3 \times 3$ .
- 6. Various answers, for example:  $3 \times 8 > 88 \div 4$ ;  $3 \times 4 > 88 \div 11$ ;  $3 \times 5 > 88 \div 8$
