1. £13 and 76p
2. B and C show an equal total of £5 and 22p.
3. Two £5 notes, two £1 coins, two 20p coins, one 10p coin and two 1p coins.
4. Various answers, for example: one £5 note, one £2 coin, one 50p coin, one 10p coin, one 5p coin and two 2p coins; one £5 note, two £1 coins, three 20p coins, one 5p coin and two 2p coins.
5. Various answers, for example: £10 and 60p; £10 and 30p; £10 and 15p
6. Freya is incorrect because there are more than two different ways of making £4 and 60p using her coins.
Various answers, for example: Two £2 coins, one 50p coin and one 10p coin;
One £2 coin, two £1 coins, two 20p coins and two 10p coins;
One £2 coin, two £1 coins, one 20p coin, two 10p coins, two 5p coins and five 2p coins.
