# Year 3 Sequencing Sentences – Guidance for Parents/Carers

### **Activity:**

The aim of this activity is for children to practise sequencing sentences. There are six questions to complete. The first three questions allow children to practise the skill, while the next three questions extend them as they have to apply their learning to get the answer.

#### Vocabulary:

A **paragraph** is a group of sentences that share a common idea. A new paragraph should be started where there is a change of time, location, character or theme.
