Year 3 Types of Nouns – Guidance for Parents

Worksheet:

The aim of this activity is for children to practise identifying the three types of nouns. There are a number of questions to complete. The first four questions allow children to practise the skill, while the next three questions extend them as they have to apply their learning to get the answer.

Vocabulary:

Nouns are naming words. It is a person, animal, thing or place.

A **Proper Noun** is a specific name for a person, place or thing. It is always capitalised.

A **Common Noun** is a generic name for a person, place or thing in a class or group, for example teacher or planet. It is not capitalised.

A **Collective Noun** is a word used for a group of people, animals or things, for example a herd or crowd. It is not capitalised.
