Activity:

The aim of this activity is for children to practise recognising sentences using the simple past and the past progressive tenses. There are three questions to complete. The first two questions allow children to practise the skill, while the third question extends them as they have to apply their learning to get the answer.

Vocabulary:

A verb is a type of word that is used to describe an action such as jump, skip, shout.

Simple Past Tense is used to describe an action that has already happened in a time before now.

Past Progressive Tense is used when an action has continued for a period of time in the past, for example: It was raining last night.

2. A and C

3. C is the odd one out because it has been written in the simple past tense. All of the other sentences have used the past progressive tense.
