# Year 4 'I' or 'Me' – Guidance for Parents/Carers

## **Activity:**

The aim of this activity is for children to practise using Standard English when using the words 'I' or 'me'. There are three questions to complete. The first two questions allow children to practise the skill, while the third question extends them as they have to apply their learning to get the answer.

# Vocabulary:

**Standard English** is the formal way of writing and speaking.

Non-standard English is English that uses colloquialisms, slang words and dialects.
