Activity:

The aim of this activity is for children to practise identifying and using relative clauses. There are three questions to complete. The first two questions allow children to practise the skill, while the third question extends them as they have to apply their learning to get the answer.

Vocabulary:

A **relative clause** adds extra information to a sentence by using relative pronouns such as 'who', 'that' or 'which'. It adds extra information about the noun in the sentence and so therefore must be related to the noun.

A relative pronoun refers back to a noun already mentioned in a sentence.
