Worksheet:

The aim of this activity is for children to practise writing relative clauses. There are a number of questions to complete. The first four questions allow children to practise the skill, while the next three questions extend them as they have to apply their learning to get the answer.

Vocabulary:

A **relative clause** adds extra information to a sentence by using relative pronouns such as 'who', 'that' or 'which'. It adds extra information about the noun in the sentence and so therefore must be related to the noun.

A **relative pronoun** such as 'who', 'that' or 'which', refers back to a noun already mentioned in a sentence.

Nouns are naming words. It is a person, animal, thing or place.
