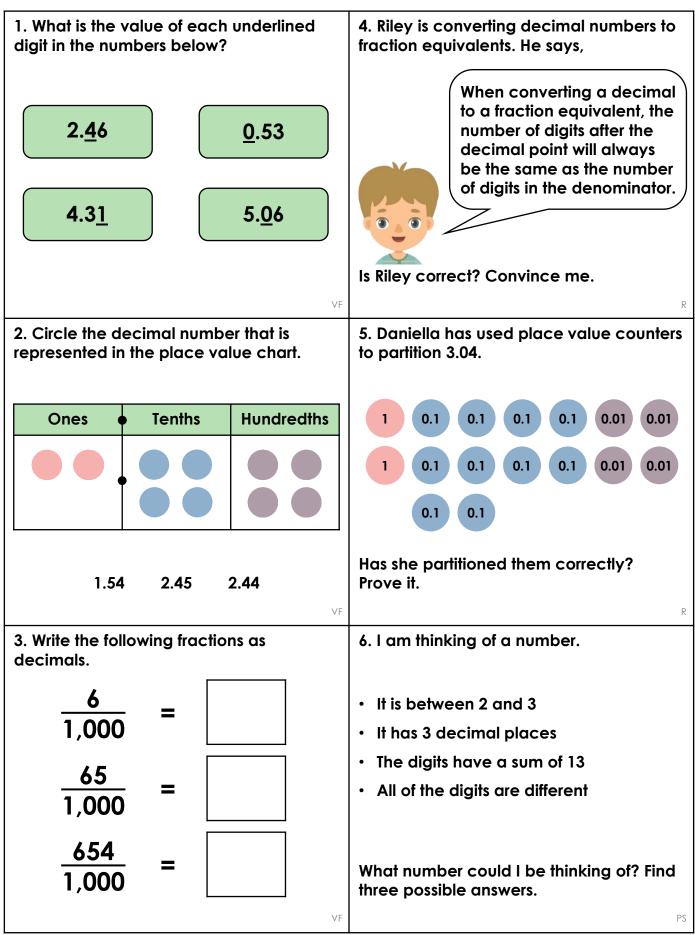

Three Decimal Places

1. Four tenths; zero ones; one hundredth; zero tenths

2. 2.44

3. 0.006; 0.065; 0.654

4. Riley is incorrect. The number of digits after the decimal point is not always the same as the number of digits in the denominator of an equivalent fraction because fractions can be simplified. For example: 0.1 could be written as $\frac{100}{1,000}$, $\frac{10}{100}$ or $\frac{1}{10}$.

5. Daniella is correct. She has used four hundredths counters and ten tenths counters. When the tenths are exchanged for a ones counter, this makes 3.04. A zero is used as a placeholder to show there are no more tenths.

6. Various answers, for example: 2.047; 2.146; 2.173; 2.641; 2.803; 2.830
