# Year 6 Read and Interpret Pie Charts - Guidance for Parents/Carers 

## Activity:

The aim of this activity is for children to practise reading and interpreting pie charts. There are three questions to complete. The first two questions allow children to practise the skill, while the third question extends them as they have to problem solve and explain their answer.

## Vocabulary:

A pie chart shows how something is divided into parts. Each slice of the pie represents a category. The bigger the slice, the higher the proportion of the data.
